LWV PARTNERS HOST CANDIDATE FORUM For Wisconsin Congressional District 8 Michael Gallagher & Amanda Stuck

NE WISCONSIN — The combined Leagues of Women Voters of Appleton, Door County, and Greater Green Bay will co-host an online Candidate Forum for Wisconsin's Congressional District 8 on Tuesday, October 6. Participating candidates will be incumbent Michael Gallagher (R) and challenger Amanda Stuck (D). Congressional District 8 includes most of northeast Wisconsin.

The forum will be recorded and available for public viewing after the event, and links will be posted on each of the three Leagues' websites and Facebook pages. LWV Appleton will post the links at www.lwvappleton.org, or on the League of Women Voters of Appleton Facebook page. Candidate information also is available on the LWV Appleton website.

Voters are encouraged to view the recorded forum during which the candidates answer a broad range of questions about current issues affecting NE Wisconsin and the country.

The purpose of the LWV Forum is to provide an impartial venue to help voters select the most qualified and best-suited person to represent them in Congress for the next two years.

This League forum is not a debate. It is a nonpartisan question and answer event that will give candidates equal time to share brief opening statements, responses to questions regarding their own positions and views, and closing remarks. Questions are screened for duplication and appropriateness and candidates do not see the questions ahead of time.
