## President's Message: Taking a Laser Focus Moving Forward

Late spring is a time to both look back at all we have accomplished together and to look forward to the coming year when we will be laser-focused on the upcoming presidential election.

#### **LOOKING BACK:**

- We sponsored meaningful programs on a variety of issues: local law enforcement, open government and open meetings, the freedom to read, affordable senior housing, and we partnered with the PAC to provide a program and workshop on race, class, and community awareness.
- We hosted two virtual Legislative Town Halls with Fox Cities legislators, partnering with the Winnebago and Greater Green Bay Leagues.
- Our Action Team provided timely alerts to our members on national, state, and local issues of concern. Our League delivered official statements to the Appleton Common Council, the Outagamie County Board, and the Grand Chute Town Board. The Executive Action Team brought together a group of highly engaged local volunteers whose interests and expertise span a wide spectrum of important issues.
- Our Events Team planned our Holiday Brunch at Bubolz that attracted 90 people, and our Annual Meeting at The Hillside at Plamann Park that was attended by 60.
- Our Communications and Technology Team continues to raise the profile of our League through outstanding newsletters, full-color brochures and posters, continuous website updates and improvements, increased attention to our League by local media, and further development of swag items.
- A committee of 17 people conducted a comprehensive review of all of our League's local positions developed over our 85-year history, identifying those positions most in need of critical updates.
- Our exemplary, dynamic Voter Services Team logged over 190 volunteer hours in voter assistance, candidate forums and interviews, and Vote411.

- Our Membership Team continued to extend our outreach to the greater Fox Cities metro area. In addition to Appleton, we now extend our reach to Freedom, Kimberly, Little Chute, Grand Chute, Menasha, Neenah, Hortonville, Harrison, Shiocton, Kaukauna, Larson, Ogdensburg, Clintonville, and Greenville, as they are also represented among our members. This year, we welcomed members from Waupaca, Larson, and New London.
- We explored DEI-themed books through a monthly book share. The DEI Team completely redesigned and updated its webpage, and increased our participation as allies with other local organizations focused on people who are marginalized in our community.
- As we transition to a new dues model, our Finance Committee conducted a successful spring finance drive that exceeded our goal of \$10,000. As a result, our League will not have to use any reserve funds for our work in the coming year.

#### LOOKING FORWARD:

- Our primary focus will be on our Voter Service Team which will be tabling at many events throughout the summer and into the fall. This will include three sessions of multiple days at the DMV where many volunteers will be needed.\* This project has been highly successful at reaching a broad cross-section of people who often are not engaged in the democratic process. In next spring's election, we will again be called upon to provide voters with critical information on candidates running for local offices. The spring election will also include a hugely consequential election for a new Wisconsin Supreme Court Justice.
- We will begin work on a new study to update our fifty-year old position on police protection, delving into the broader topic of public safety. We will examine this issue from a Fox Cities regional and DEI perspective. Here too, many volunteers will be needed, and there is no better way to learn about a public policy issue than a League study. Our resulting positions make a meaningful positive difference in our community.
- When the calendar turns over to 2025, our Action Team will really gear up. We will follow municipal, county and state budget development through a new legislature elected with fair maps for the first time in 15 years. This will be an exciting new era for the Fox Cities where the senate and assembly maps have significantly changed.
- Our Events Team is now workingcurrently planning our Summer Picnic at 1000 Islands Nature Center in Kaukauna. This fun social event will also be an opportunity to provide an introduction to League for prospective new members. We will provide the brats and burgers. Bring a dish to pass and a friend!

As you can see, the work of our League is truly a TEAM EFFORT! There are so many ways for you to get involved. Raise your hand, and one of our team leaders will call on you!

Do you know what your new state assembly and senate districts are?

Do you know who will be on the ballot in the August 13 primary and November 5 general election?

#### Has your polling place changed?

You will be able to find out the answers to all these questions at a nonpartisan informational meeting on **Thursday**, **July 11** at the **Neenah Public Library**. The meeting will be held in the Shattuck Room from **6:30-8:00 p.m**. It is jointly sponsored by the Leagues of Women Voters of Appleton-Fox Cities, Winnebago County, and Wisconsin.

League leaders and members of the Fair Maps coalition will explain the dramatic changes in local legislative districts. Maps of the former districts and the new districts will be available.

The new Wisconsin legislative maps, which are the result of a 15-year campaign against the practice of gerrymandering, will make our legislators more accountable to their constituents. Information on the next steps toward a permanent nonpartisan process for redistricting also will be discussed.

State legislative candidates in the Fox Valley area will be invited to attend and asked to make a short statement introducing themselves to voters. This event will not be a candidate forum.

After a year-long review of our positions through a DEI and Fox Cities regional lens, the following preamble to our positions was adopted:




Our local League chapter was founded in 1939. Over many decades, we focused on Appleton and Outagamie County, conducting studies to develop our local positions. Our League has grown along with the increasingly diverse Fox Cities region, and in 2021, officially became the League of Women Voters of Appleton-Fox Cities. In order to expand our outreach and influence and to maintain current and future relevancy, we hereby adopt this preamble to our positions document.



The League of Women Voters of Appleton-Fox Cities is committed to strengthening our communities by empowering individuals and groups to better engage with their government. Whether explicitly stated or not, the League of Women Voters of Appleton-Fox Cities affirms that our local governments, commissions, and advisory committees must reflect the diversity of our communities and uphold the right of every individual to live a healthy and authentic life with a sense of belonging, respect, and acceptance. We intentionally advocate with, and for all to be treated with dignity, including those who are marginalized, stereotyped, misunderstood, or intentionally ignored.







A new comprehensive study on public safety was adopted for the coming year. A committee will delve into all areas of public safety inclusive of the Fox Cities metro area. This will require a group of dedicated volunteers, so watch for further information to become part of this exciting project.



Following a very successful spring finance drive that exceeded its goal of \$10,000, members voted to approve a budget for the new fiscal year of July 1, 2024 through June 30, 2025. We expect our financial needs to be fully funded without using any reserves.
