#### Mental Health Study-Update

The League of Women Voters of Appleton Board of Directors has accepted the following questions for study from the Mental Health Study Committee:

- \* How can we develop a regional system for the provision of mental health services that enhances the quality and access of care, provides the needed specialized care, and encourages the recruitment and retention of providers in the mental health profession?
- \* How can we influence our current health care systems, both public and private, to provide more responsive access and better mental health care?
- \* How can we educate our citizens, community leaders, consumers, governmental bodies and health providers, public and private, for profit and non-profit, insurers,

hospitals and managed care organizations so that the likelihood of creating a more regional and sustainable system for providing mental health care is created?

- \* How can a mental health coalition be formed to provide ongoing evaluation of mental health services, to monitor the progress toward insurance parity, and to report to the community the ability of the system to meet the current mental health needs?
- \* How can the League of Women Voters most effectively call for the necessary changes in the mental health system to accomplish the goals for improvement?

All League members are encouraged to participate in this study. Two opportunities to learn more about this community's current mental health service delivery system and some of the existing barriers to accessing the system are upcoming.

YOU can help by sharing the Election Official brochures with your friends and neighbors. The Appleton specific brochure and generic one for folks who live in surrounding communities are available on our website


