## **Three ways to League action**

o League of Women Voters members, "action" means taking action to support our carefully considered positions.

Typically, this means contacting our legislators in support of—or opposition to—a specific piece of legislation. After the anthrax mail scare, e-mail became the method of choice for national legislators. Once we learned how to use it, it was easy to use this method for contacting state and local representatives as well.

The most efficient way to coordinate Appleton League members' involvement in the legislative process seems to be by e-mailing Action Alerts. Here are three ways you can make a difference by participating in the League's Action Alert process.

 Respond to Action Alerts forwarded by Vice President-Action Nadine Miller (<u>nadinemiller@tds.net--add</u> this address to your approved senders list if your e-mail program requires it). If you wish to opt out of this service, just reply to any of these e-mails. Each subject line will start with "LWV Action: topic," so you'll know it's a League Action Alert.

- 2. Sign up for Action Alerts from the National League of Women Voters to be e-mailed directly to you. On the home page of the national site, look on the right-hand side of the page and click on Action Alerts or click on this hyperlink: <a href="http://takeaction.lwv.org/lwv/mlm/signup">http://takeaction.lwv.org/lwv/mlm/signup</a>
- 3. 
