On February 7, the Mental Health Study Committee held the first unit meeting which resulted in a second draft or our Mental Health Care Positions which now reads:

LWV-Appleton supports:

A mental health care system which is community based and includes financial and geographic accessibility for residents of all ages. This system should include same day service availability and immediate care options for all. This system should be adequately staffed in both the in-patient and outpatient care arenas insuring that no person in need of services would be turned away or made to wait. Appropriate on-going, affordable treatment options for all persons should be available regardless of one's ability to pay.

A mental health system where care is coordinated between the providers of services to publicly insured, privately insured and uninsured consumers. Coordination should exist between primary health providers, mental health providers, pharmaceutical providers and public and private insurers. Provider should share all treatment options with individual consumers and assure that consumers understand their options for care.

A mental health system in which all providers have knowledge of the complete delivery system in the community and are purposeful in understanding the ability to pay of all consumers.

A mental health system in which referrals between private, non-profit and for-profit providers are utilized to ensure the best overall patient care and least duplication within the mental health delivery system.

A mental health crisis care system that is responsive, well staffed, and adequately supported.

The Mental Health Study Committee will hold the second unit meeting on Thursday, March 6, 2008. Again, we will meet at the Harmony Cafe at 11:30 am. This is the final work to be done on our Mental Health Care position before bringing it to the Annual Meeting on May 15, 2008. Check our website for information.


