- In September, I spoke at the Poverty Coalition meeting to introduce the LWV-Appleton and our work on the 2010 Census. The LWV-Appleton became a member of the Poverty Coalition by paying a one-time membership fee of \$25. We support the Poverty Coalition through our Positions in Social Policy Sections II. Juveniles at Risk, IV. Housing, and VI. Public Health Services. Our membership also is in alignment with the LWV-Wisconsin Position: Social Policy Meeting Basic Human Needs.
