

Treasurer's Report by Sue Silton

The annual meeting included lively discussion about our dues. We voted to raise our regular membership dues to \$60 and household membership dues to \$90. Why these numbers? In 2011-12 our obligation to the state and national leagues will be \$60. For a household membership it will be \$90. It was decided that we must at least cover these costs in our dues.

Our actual expenses are approximately \$50 more per member. Sustaining membership and additional member and non-member donations account for much of this; however, we have been using some of our savings to cover some of our expenses. One of the directives to the board at the annual meeting was to look for new sources of revenue.

It was also decided to add a budget item in our expenses to cover up to three regular memberships in the form of scholarships.

We have just finished this spring's finance drive. This drive targeted our past and present members as well as several friends. This fall, we are planning on contacting additional non-members, including businesses, corporations and attendees of last year's Women's Equality Day Luncheon.

Colleen Rortvedt guided us expertly through a hefty meeting loaded with information about the results of two major studies exploring the future of the library. I could relate facts to you, but instead, I am going to tell you that you can find all of the information regarding the studies on the Library website. Click on the icon displaying books labeled

"Library Building Process." Some points of interest...for every dollar invested in a public library; there is a \$4.06 return according to an economic impact research report. Both studies recommended that one centralized downtown library be retained, rejecting branches. The present library was built in 1981, well before the needs of a technological age. The economic issues facing the library to meet

Fox River Walk & Informational Meeting by Jan Quinlan

April 29, 2011

The weather was chilly but the rain stayed away. A group of hardy LWV members and guests were led by Appleton's Director of Community Development Karen Harkness on river trails starting at Olde Oneida Street to Lawe Street and beyond. We saw development sites on both sides of the river, many pelicans and geese, historic locks and locks tenders' houses, and much more. Joining us for the walk were Dave Horst, Community Foundation's Communications Director, kayaker, and free lance environmental reporter for the Post-Crescent, and Vickie Milde, president of the Fox Cities Greenways Board.



Following the river walk, we reconvened the group at Trolley Square, Palace Car Room, for coffee and a continental breakfast. There we met Candice Mortara, President of Friends of the Fox and the Fox Wisconsin Heritage Parkway; Bill Lecker, Appleton's Director of Parks and Recreation. They and Dave Horst presented updates on the Fox River corridor from an environmental perspective. We studied maps and learned success stories but also discussed challenges facing our community as we balance economic growth with environmental concerns. All agreed this was an informative update on our LWV Fox River Corridor studies – and we thanked our special guests for sharing this information with us.

Let It Be A Dance..."Let it be a dance we do, may I have this dance with you!" Can you see him on the dance floor with Donna, his eyes twinkling, enjoying the fullness of life as was his way.

Len's life is a model for showing us how to live. He lived life with gusto, meaning, and joy.
