

Our Young People—Your Voter Service Director's Experiences

After our Voter Service Registration Assistance at Appleton North High School, one of the teachers within the Appleton Career Academy charter school, Mark Ropella, contacted me to ask that I come speak to his class about what motivates me to be a part of the League and to help voters to register. Just before I left to travel to North, I sent Mark the link to the music video on iTunes based on the story of the fight for women's suffrage as depicted in the movie Iron Jawed Angels: **Bad Romance: Women's Suffrage.** Imagine my surprise when I walked into the classroom and the video was playing! The students told me they didn't quite get the full story, but they knew the Lady Gaga song (to be honest, I was the direct opposite; was that Lady Gaga? Really?).

Interestingly, they were reading the book <u>Drive: The Surprising Truth About What Motivates Us</u> by Daniel Pink.
